SILENT KEY DAVID BENTON, W2WSE, #3008

David Benton (Dave/W2WSE) became a Silent Key on May 19, 2010 around 1:00 pm GMT after a long illness. David died peacefully in his sleep. He was born April 2, 1921 in Boston, MA and spent most of his professional career in NYC and Omaha, NE with AT&T and Northwestern Bell. He was a 1940 graduate of Phillips Exeter Academy and a 1947 graduate of Harvard College. He married Jeanne Proctor of Arlington, NJ in 1944, and they raised three children. Dave and Jeanne retired in 1978 to relax by the ocean in Sea Girt, NJ and on the Caribbean island of Montserrat during most winters.

Communications was the defining theme in Dave's life. Nurturing a keen interest in amateur radio in his youth eventually led to a career with AT&T, and involvement with the ham radio community throughout his life. He built his own equipment from Heath kits, as well as the family's first TV and stereo speakers.

He married Jeanne Proctor on April 1, 1944, just before shipping out as a 1st Lieutenant in the 401st Heavy Bombardment Group with the 8th Air Force in WWII. From July through

December in 1944 he flew 35 missions over Germany as a bombardier, receiving the Air medal with silver cluster, two Bronze Battle Stars and a Presidential Unit Citation.

Remembering that the root of the word "amateur" means "to love," Dave's amateur pursuits were things he truly loved to do. He had a vegetable garden wherever he lived and enjoyed turning his harvest into memorable meals for his family and friends through the alchemy of his cooking skills. He turned a deft hand to building his own radio equipment, and communicated with friends all over the world by ham radio and Morse code. Dave played boogie-woogie piano and listened to the jazz greats Ramsey Lewis, Ella Fitzgerald and Louis Armstrong. He volunteered for Omaha civil defense communications, and turned his eyes towards the skies as an amateur astronomer.

He and Jeanne were married for almost 53 years when Jeanne preceded him in death in 1997. He will be missed by his three children Tracy Benton (Barry Schneider) of St. Paul, MN; David Benton (Pat Kelly) of Madison, WI; and Leslie Benton Bjorncrantz (Ed Bjorncrantz) of Evanston, IL; two grandchildren Molly Benton Schneider (NYC) and William Benton Bjorncrantz (IL); and his sibling Peter Benton (VT). Other siblings, John Benton (MA), Mary Benton Jameson (MA), and Nicholas Benton (NYC) preceded him in death. David Benton was the son of Jay R. Benton and Frances Hill Benton of Belmont, MA.

Family memorial gatherings will be held in Madison, WI and Sea Girt, NJ this summer.

On 18th birthday, after attending Midland Radio and TV School in Kansas City, Mo. and receiving Radio Telegraph and Telephone licenses, was hired by Braniff Airlines as radio operator. Radio telegraphy was used to send and receive requests for flight reservations and operational messages, and Radio Telephony to maintain contact with aircraft.

WWII began and with deferments, was requested to train female radio operators but soon after was drafted and shipped to serve with the 25th Infantry Division in Luzon, Phillippines. At wars end we were sent to Japan and was later able to transfer to Hq. Co. Inf. Sig. Corp. Tech 4. Returned to Braniff and found telegraphy was being replaced with teletypes. Teletypes eventually replaced by computers. I unwittingly let my ham license



No. 7 The Rules Say... John B. Johnston, W3BE, #3946.

Land of Environmental Importance

Q. That phrase, "Land of environmental importance or that is significant in American history, architecture or culture" in Section 97.13(a) could be reasonably interpreted to mean almost anywhere in the United States. The rules provide no guidance at all as to when the licensee of an amateur station is required to provide an Environmental Assessment.

A. The National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is the basis for that section which says the licensee may be required to take certain actions prescribed by Sections 1.1305-1.1319. In those prescribing sections, it is explained that the FCC has reviewed representative actions and has found no common pattern that would enable it to specify actions that will automatically require an environmental impact statement.

W3BE-O-GRAM: Evidently, the FCC is cognizant that it is not expert on these highly sensitive considerations. Perhaps some local environmental, historical and cultural specialists could advise you accordingly.

Q. Consider this frequency diversity arrangement for moon-bounce: identical transmissions on two channels within the same band, with both being fed to the same antenna. What would be the power limit?

A. Under Section 97.313, it would be the peak-envelope-power output from each individual transmitter that must not exceed the maximum number of watts specified for the band or segment.

Q. For a CW transmission where the power limit is 1500 watts, if two separate signals were to be generated whose information band width is small compared to the carrier frequency separation, can their maximum power be set to 750 watts each since each signal can be considered as in a different channel?

A. Where both signals are from the same transmitter, Section 97.313(b) limits the transmitter power to the maximum of 1.5 kW PEP. Where each signal is from a different transmitter, the 1.5 kW PEP limit would apply to each transmitter.

Bear in mind, however, the power magnitude that must be used when determining whether or not the station exceeds the threshold limits for the routine RF environmental evaluation. That is specified in Section 97.13(c). Note that it is that of the PEP input to the station antenna. For repeaters, however, the power exclusion is based upon effective radiated power.
